

Performs January 14, 2023 at Franklin Jr. High Event Center

Born in northeastern Ontario, Verch was trained from birth in the specific rhythms and melodies of the region. Growing up bouncing between weekend festivals and listening to her Dad's country band for dances, she thought that everyone played the fiddle and step-danced. Beginning with performances as the "token cute kid" at fairs, festivals, and TV shows, she went on to study at Berklee College of Music. These educational opportunities defines her artistic, delicate voice, energetic footwork, sand paper foot percussion and stunning playing (sometimes combined all at once!) Her ability to preserve the authentic folk traditions of the past and reintroduce them into the musical landscape of the present is a testament to her expert musicianship and widespread appeal. Her historic wins at the Canadian Grand Masters Fiddling Championship and Canadian Open Old-Time Fiddlers' Contest at the ages of 18 and 19 provided her with the intuition to "dance the tune" and improvise fluency in both fiddling and step dancing. After touring with established acts like Canadian country music legend Tommy Hunter and Celtic pop band Mad Pudding as a back fiddler, she formed her own band, the April Verch Band (a trio of world-class musicians). They have traveled four continents, performed in fourteen countries and played from tiny pubs, festivals to legendary stages as the Kennedy Center and Ryman Auditorium. Verch toured with Canadian fiddle supergroup Bowfire and acclaimed Irish Tenor, John McDermott. The highlight of her career was participating in the Opening Ceremonies for the 2010 Winter Olympic Games in Vancouver. In 2016 she began partnership with American legend, Joe Newberry. Collaborations included: International Bluegrass Music Association's Wide Open Bluegrass Festival in Raleigh, North Carolina, Celtic Connections Festival in Glasgow, Scotland, Estonian quartet Curly Strings titled The Heritage Project in 2018, and now a duo with her husband, Cody Walters in 2020. Teaching has been at the heart of her work from the beginning (released a book of original fiddle tunes, Canadian fiddle method book, and a self-produced instructional step dance DVD). Verch never forgets her roots of her music.



February 18, 2023 at Franklin Jr. High Event Center

This Irish-American Folk powerhouse brings unique energy and pure friendship to their live shows. Ohio brothers John and Daniel McKewen, father and son Phil and Josh Franck, and lifelong friend Bryan Brookes brings to the stage "we dare to hold still" Irish dance tunes as well as gamut of songs and good humor. Each Lad is a multi-instrumentalist. The combined lineup includes fiddle, button accordion, tenor banjo, flute, whistle, guitar, bouzouki, Uilleann pipes, 5- string banjo, concertina and bodhran. The Drowsy Lads thundered onto the Irish music scene in the US over 15 years ago. They bring fire and excitement that is quickly winning over audiences. 2018 brought the release of their 4th album, Everyone In and with the distinction of "Best Irish American Band" The Lads are lightening up Irish Festivals including Milwaukee, Dublin, Dayton, Indianapolis, Buffalo, and Michigan. They are regular guests at theaters including Murphy Theater, Lakeside Ohio's Chantauqua Concert Series

and guest artists with the Otterbein University Orchestra.

Aoife Scott is from Dublin, Ireland, and born into the legendary Black Family. She is one of the best award winning folk singer/songwriter artists. Fragile and ethereal one minute and strong and vibrant the next, her dynamic and profound vocals explore the emotional depths of her lyrics, leaving the audience entranced. Two released albums: CARRY THE DAY (2016) and HOMEBIRD (2020) were launched at the Temple Bar Trad Festival. She was awarded the ASLR Celtic Music Awards Female Vocalist of 2020 and her album received in 2021 ASLR Celtic Music Awards Female Vocal album of the year. Her success with single released songs deserve recognition. "All Along the Wild Atlantic Way" song of the year at Irish Folk Music Awards (2017), "The December Letter" (2019) the most played Christmas song on RTE Radio won single of the year at the ALSR, A new single, "Sweet October" (2020) born out of the downtime of a summer festival season cancelled and is now available across all platforms. Her association with multiple award winning musicians (Ron Block, Sierra Hull, Stuart Duncan, cousins - Roisin O & Danny O'Reilly, Barry Bales) has contributed to her career successes. Her unique sound and broad creative scope of music will entertain you.
